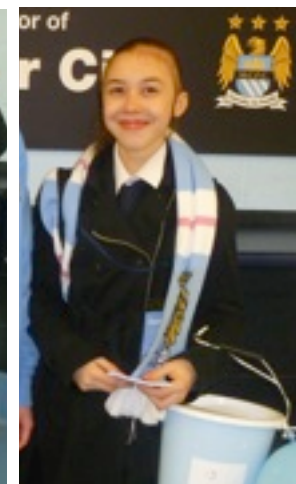
TOURAIID
